N. Scott Momaday has a new book out. A collection of more than 200 poems, *The*

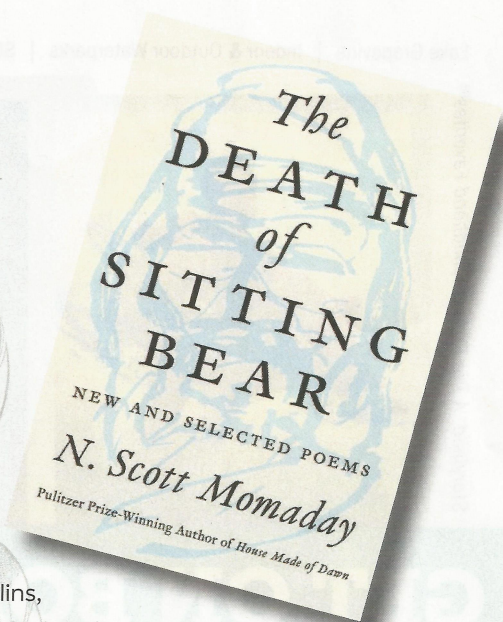
Death of Sitting Bear (HarperCollins,

Texas Shoe Company Makes a Smaller Footprint

When she launched shoe company **Suavs** in Austin in 2015, founder Monxi Garza was already thinking about sustainability: recycling and composting more in her personal life, reducing packaging for her company, and donating unsold shoes to nonprofit groups. Then she decided to take it a step further by overseeing the development of a digital knit fabric made entirely from recycled plastic bottles and 100 percent vegan materials. Starting this year, all Suavs shoes will be made this way. The result is a soft, durable shoe loved by hikers and travelers. “There’s a lot of different ways you can go eco-friendly,” says Garza. “Smaller everyday choices can make a big impact.” \$76–\$110.
