


DAY TRIP 1

Rumored to have hosted Sam Houston and Jesse James, the hotel and restaurant have been overhauled, but the cozy dining room still serves such traditional favorites as 1861 Hush Puppies made with the inn's original recipe. Try your hand at glassblowing, pottery making, and ceramics at SALADO GLASSWORKS (254-947-0339; saladoglassworks.com) or RO SHAW CLAY STUDIO (254-410-6361; roshawclaystudio.com), neighbors on Peddler's Alley. Then peruse the area's art studios and sculpture garden.

Order lunch at THE SHED, a no-frills tavern serving pulled-pork Salado Sliders and Shed (Frito) Pie. If the weather's pleasant, relax on the patio—you can even bring your pup. Closed Tuesdays. (254) 947-1960; inncreek.com/the-shed.

A 10-minute drive north of town takes you to CHALK RIDGE FALLS PARK, where you can enjoy a 3-mile hike along the Lampasas River. Keep your eyes out for the waterfall and suspension bridge. (254) 939-2461.
